We are pleased to announce that all results for Semester Two are now "live" on QSIS and accessible for you to view via the 'View My Grades' page on Qsis – Campus Community > Student Services Ctr (Student) > Grades.

All Students

It is important that you very carefully read information issued by email earlier this week about the interpretation of the different examination code (Exam Board Notes - EBNs) and the different options available to you. For clarification and guidance on your progress, please contact the relevant contact identified in the table below by email in the first instance.

1. Any student who submitted work for assessment after the 16th March 2020 is entitled, under the Supplementary Regulations, to retake the elements of the assessment submitted after 16th March again, irrespective of whether they passed or failed the assessment. Students who wish to avail of this opportunity must complete the online form by noon on Thursday 25th June 2020 to indicate their intention to resit that element. Please note however that practical elements may not be able to be retaken until next academic year.

Students in final year who chose to retake any relevant assessments in

order to attempt to improve marks will still receive their final award in July and an amended transcript will be awarded if marks change. It is important to be aware that the reassessment tasks will be entirely new tasks and will therefore mean an entirely new submission rather than an amendment or adjustment to previously submitted work. FAILURE TO REPOND BY THIS DATE WILL BE CONSIDERED AN INDICATION OF ACCEPTANCE OF THE EXISTING PASS MARK.

2. If you are undertaking assessment tasks in August for any reason, please note that staff will be available by email on Friday 26th June to answer module specific queries about resit tasks. Staff may be on leave after this date so please ensure all your queries are submitted and answered at this time as it may not be possible to address these later in the summer before the submission date.

If you are a final year student who has now received your last set of module results and your final degree classification, we offer you our warmest congratulations – well done on your achievements.

In order to reduce the risk of spread of the Covid-19 (coronavirus), Queen's University has taken the decision to postpone the summer graduation ceremonies. A formal graduation will take place during the 2020-21 academic year and details will be provided as soon as the arrangements are in place. Please keep a regular check on your emails and subsequent student bulletins for more information. Students will be issued with their degree parchments by post from the middle of July onwards, following confirmation that the student has completed their degree studies. To facilitate the issuing of these

parchments, <u>completed students</u>
<u>are required to register in advance</u>
and confirm some information.

Please note that students receiving parchments for courses that would normally be classified as 'Not to be presented' must also register via the portal (this includes PGCE EYE students and students exiting with postgraduate certificates, and postgraduate diplomas).

The portal is **now open** for registration and can be accessed by logging into Qsis and navigating to Main Menu > Self Service > Degree Progress/Graduation > Parchment Registration. On this page, students will be asked to confirm that their name and address details are correct in order for us to issue the correct parchment to them at the appropriate address. **Deadline for registration is Thursday 2 July 2020 at 12 noon**.
