
There will be some missing letters in the wordbook. Try and think of what you have learnt so far and fill in the missing letters. Think about how many letters are in each word and what letters come before or after.







On the next two pages, write your spellings out in different colours.




Remember to use lots of different colours. You can use crayons, felt tips, colouring pencils or coloured pens.






Remember if two words begin with the same letter, look at the second letter and put it in alphabetical order.
