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Unit Annotations (Summative)

Lesson annotations are required on the document, focusing on the following aspects of the lesson delivery:

- Sequencing – Did the lessons flow in the correct order?
- Chunking – Were the individual ‘chunks’ of learning appropriate?
- Pace – Was enough lesson time allocated to each ‘chunk’ of learning?
- Coherence and Progression – Were there opportunities for the learning to connect?
- Impact on Learning – Were the Unit Learning Intentions met? How do you know?

Copy and Paste this ‘post-it’ note and place it on the part of the Unit planne where the annotation applies, then add your comment.

How to include the annotations:

Copy and Paste the yellow ‘post-it’ style textbox opposite, and move it to the part of the Unit planner where you want to add a comment. This post-it note can be resized and edited accordingly. These can be added to the document as it is delivered, or you can add them as a summative comment at the end of the delivery of the full Unit.

You should include approximately 3-5 annotations per Unit document.

Be specific with your comments, in particular focusing on individual/ groups of pupils where necessary, and on the impact of the unit design and implementation on learning.

E.g. Annotation 1: “This lesson should have connected to the prior lesson more carefully.”

E.g. Annotation 2: “I should have dedicated more time to the concepts in this lesson. Two lessons rather than one might have worked better.”

E.g. Annotation 3: “We have to pause today to revisit how to do simple equations. Prior knowledge was weak; I should have checked this before the main lesson started.”

E.g. Annotation 4: “The pupils have clearly learnt the key learning intentions of the unit, but LI2 was underdeveloped compared to the other LI’s.”
